**ARIZONA VETERANS STANDDOWN ALLIANCE TO HOLD 2025 MARICOPA COUNTY STANDDOWN**

**PHOENIX, ARIZONA (February 26, 2025)** - The Arizona Veterans StandDown Alliance (AVSA), a program of the [Arizona Housing Coalition](#), is set to host its annual Maricopa County StandDown on March 13-14 at the Arizona State Fairgrounds. At least 1,200 U.S. military veterans who are experiencing (or at risk of) homelessness and housing instability in the Phoenix metro area are expected to attend.

The Maricopa County StandDown event is intended to provide resources and services to these veterans, including legal, benefits, social security, haircut, employment, housing, vision, mental health, medical/vaccination, meal, and pet support. Over 100 service providers will be on-site on Thursday, March 13 and Friday, March 14 to help veterans regain stability and get on a path to housing security and self-sufficiency. In addition to providing veterans with support, the StandDown also aims to increase the community's awareness of the needs of veterans struggling to make ends meet.
